Ham YL Net Control (Suggested Script as of 12-13-19)

Notes to Net Control: Be flexible and willing to show your personality. Also feel free to change the order of discussions (fellowship, Technical, Emergency Response).

OPENING THE NET;

Ask "Is this frequency in use" (if no response continue)

"CQ, CQ, CQ" . This is the YL Net.

This is ______ (call sign & name) calling the Net of the YLs (Young Ladies) of the TAG Area. That's the TN, Alabama and Georgia areas, as well as, all YL's everywhere. The purpose of this Net is to provide a forum for female hams of all ages, relationship status and ham experience to meet on the air for fellowship to discuss common interests, technical topics and prepare for emergency communications. We invite ALL female Hams to check into this net.

Is there a station willing to serve as alternate net control? Call now. (wait for response and thank the station for serving as alternate net control)

This is a directed net, which means that all communications are directed to Net Control and stations should wait to be acknowledged.

We currently meet every Monday Night at 8:00 PM at our new home on the W4GTA 145.350 repeater. It has a negative offset and requires a tone of 100.0. The backup repeater is 444.100, which has a positive offset and requires no tone. You can also access this net using EchoLink Node N9ZEN-R #6858-1.

There are many more ways to connect to the YL Net -

Locally: you can connect through the 154.350 W4GTA repeater located on Lookout Mountain

Echo Link Node: 68581 (thats the N9ZEN-R)

However, you can also connect via the 144.920 N4LMC repeater located on Signal Mountain, which requires a 146.2 tone

And for those of you who may enjoy or have the ability to get on 220, the N4LMC 224.560 repeater is also linked in, as is the SE-Link, echo link conference node

You may notice that we are leaving a bigger gap in communications for repeaters and links to reset, as this is not always a concurrent process. This is about 5 seconds, and it not only allows for our EchoLink participants to key up, it will also allow for any emergency traffic to get hold of the repeater if necessary. (As we've learned quick keying is a bad habit at the YL's have been doing a great job in not being that operator, thank you!) Is there any emergency or priority traffic? (Handle immediately as received or hearing none, say 'hearing none' and move on).

I would like to remind all stations that this is a directed Net and should follow appropriate procedures. Whenever possible stations needing to leave early should call Net Control and advise you require an 'Early Close', are 'In and Out', 'Short Timing' or are requesting to secure your stations.

Announcements:

I want to remind all stations listening that we are a ham radio enthusiast community. We belong to and support many clubs in the area and are **NOT** affiliated specifically with **ANY** club. Please share your club events and activities and support those that you feel inclined to support.
